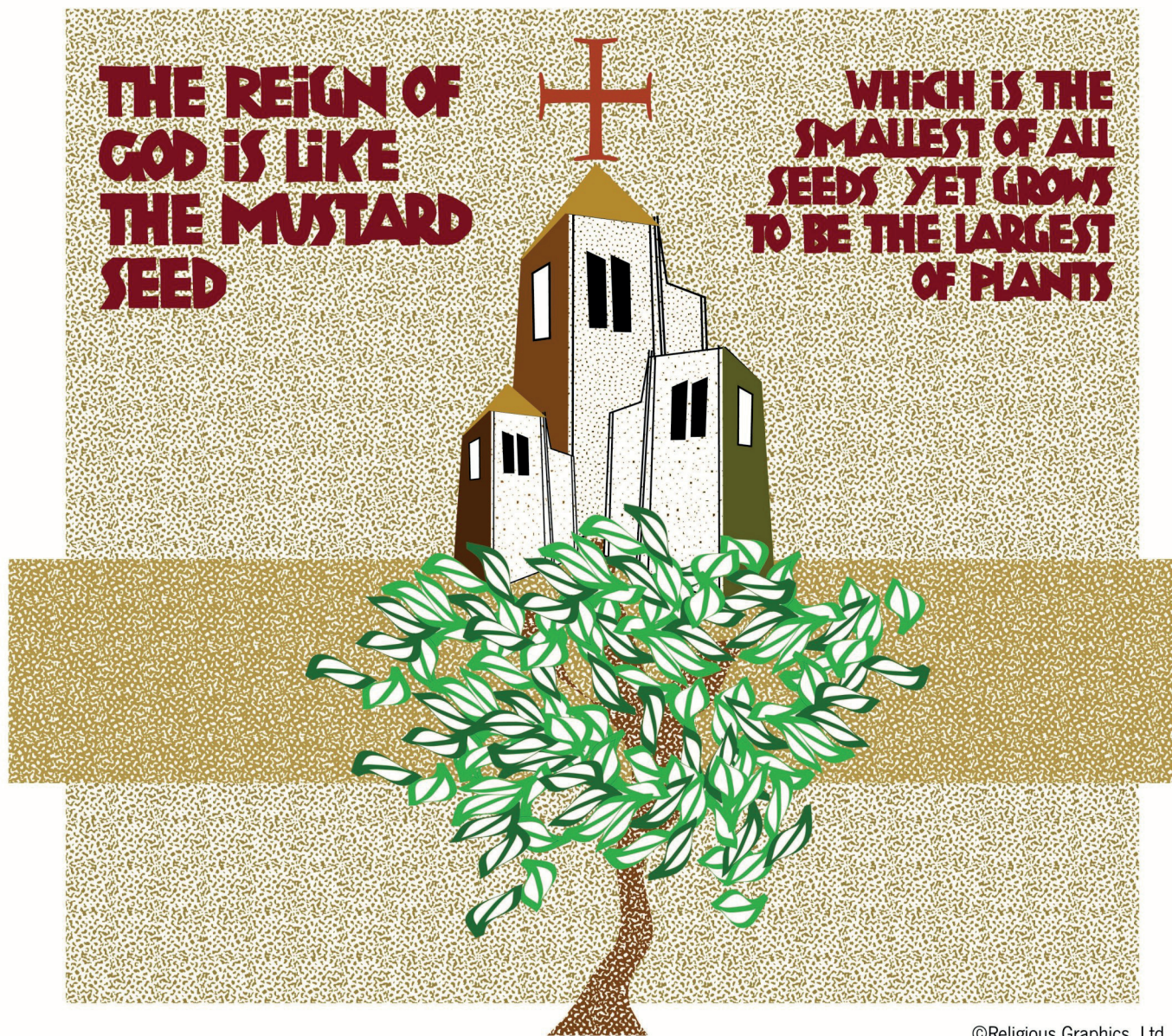

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint Bernard's Faith Family,

**Jesus spoke to the people in another parable:
“The Kingdom of Heaven is like yeast that a
woman took and mixed with three measures of
wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened.”**

We can see from the Gospel passage that the people Jesus was preaching to were country folk, close to the earth, aware of the rise and fall of the seasons, and with a keen eye for the harvest time. Jesus compares the Church, the people of God, to a field where wheat and weeds grow side by side until the harvest, only then the good are separated from the wicked.

Yeast is small—invisible once it is worked into the dough, and yet, its influence is pervasive and powerful. This simple image—yeast worked into three measures of flour, causing it to slowly rise—reveals that the Kingdom of Heaven is built quietly, almost imperceptibly, from within. Like leaven silently transforming dough from the inside, so too does God's grace operate—hidden yet active—in the heart, in the Church, and in the world.

Patently watching dough rise can be a small wonder to us. In this brief parable, the yeast symbolizes the Word of God, and the wheat flour, the human soul. When God's Word is welcomed by faith, it possesses the power to transform the entire soul. Just as yeast elevates and expands flour into bread, so God's Word elevates human nature and conforms it to Himself.

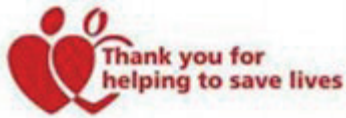
Recently, I had a conversation with an inspiring young lady named Nicole Stango who is pursuing missionary work with FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) at the U.S. Naval Academy this upcoming Fall semester. Many young people drift away from their faith during their college years, a pivotal time when they establish the beliefs and values that will shape the rest of their lives. Ernie Meditz Memorial Summer Blood Drive

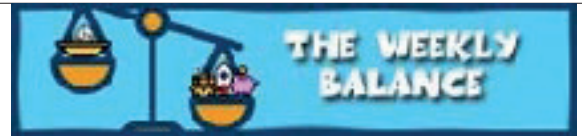
