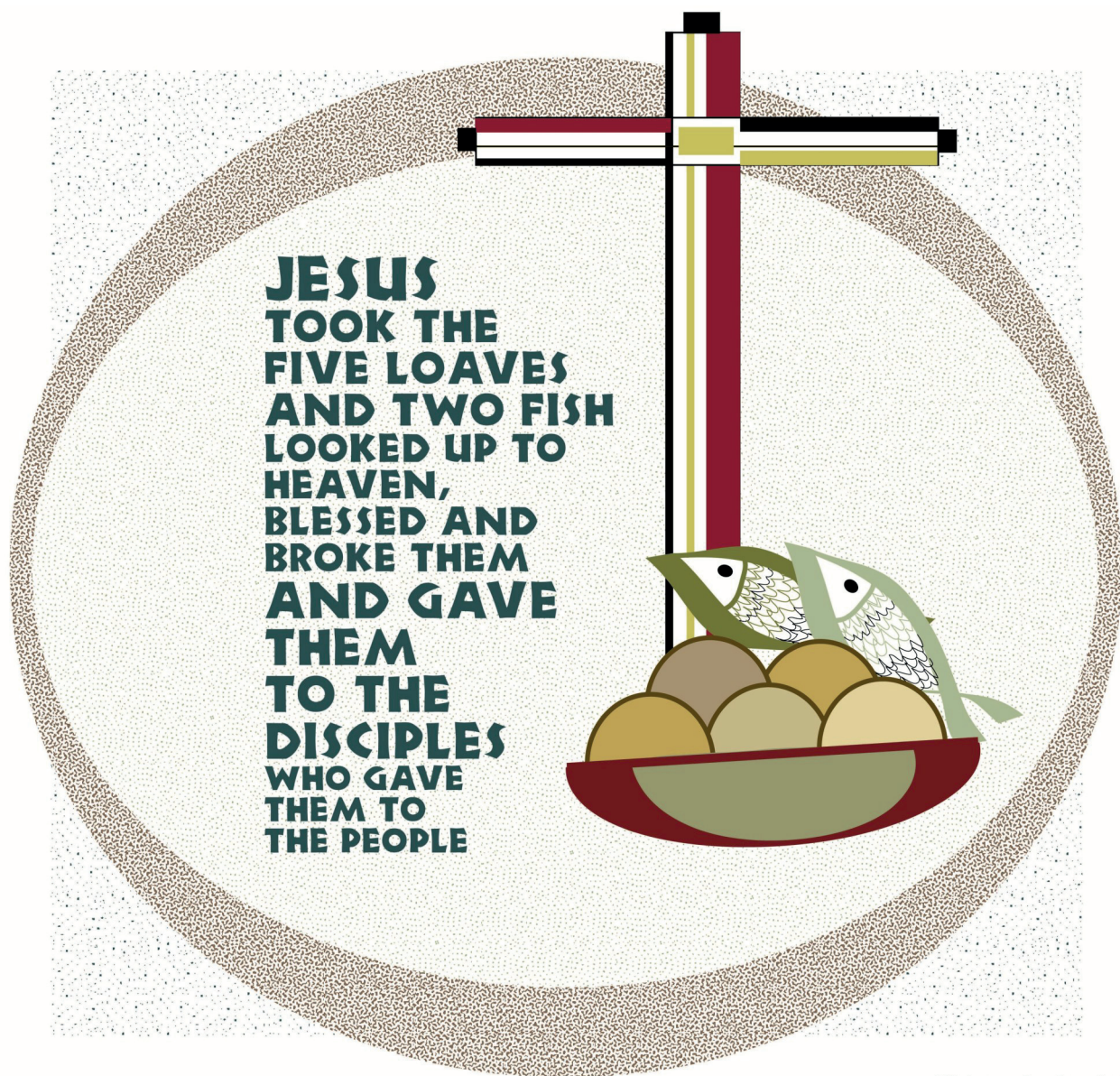

A Spirituality of “Stuff”



Last February I moved from my home of 26 years to a new home. (Pro tip: NEVER move in the winter!) I’m calling it a “pre-emptive aging move.” My previous home was great, but as a single person pushing 70 with no kids, I realized that my 1 bed/1 bath upper-level condo wasn’t really suitable to age in. Having worked in Church ministry for 45 years, I’ve heard one too many stories from people who didn’t think about this until it was too late and then were forced into an unwanted move. I wanted to get ahead of that. I was able to qualify for affordable senior housing. I now have a home on the ground floor, 2 beds/2 baths, a small deck, and room to welcome out-of-town guests, which I have already done 3 times this summer. There were trade-offs, but it was a good move.

So when the movers came to give me estimates, they eyed my place quickly, estimated the number of cartons, and gave me a price. They said to call and adjust once I was fully packed. So I packed and packed and packed. (Glad I did this when I was relatively “young”!) All told, in addition to furniture, I ended up with 130 boxes.

How does a single person, who most people who know me would say lives a simple, uncluttered life, have *one hundred and thirty* boxes of stuff??

Something about that made me uncomfortable – a discomfort that I am still struggling with. Well, I love to cook and entertain, so I have a lot of cooking and entertaining stuff. And I’m a teacher, so I have lots of books. (Probably a third of those boxes were books!) It’s not like *luxury* stuff or anything. It’s all *good* stuff, right?

When I watch the news online or on TV, I see image after image of people in our world who have little to no “stuff.” Maybe a pot to cook in, a mat to sleep on, and the clothes on their back – that’s it. So many innocent people have heartbreakingly lost all their “stuff” due to war. Then there are those who have a minimal amount of stuff – enough to stay healthy and well (maybe *ten* boxes?) – who are happy and generous people, even giving of the little they have.

One hundred and thirty boxes. All of my new rooms full of “stuff.” I am rich.

I’m not going to do the St. Francis thing and suddenly give everything away. But I continue to think and pray about this. (Do I really need *three different* graters/zesters??) I’ve been more thoughtful about keeping stuff and purchasing new stuff, especially when my stuff and my money could be better used to help those who really do need stuff.

It’s not that I think that I shouldn’t have stuff – even maybe three graters/zesters. But I do believe – and believe that the Gospel demands – that *everybody* should have stuff. In a world where there are more than enough resources for everyone to have enough stuff, why don’t they? So what can I do, and what can we all do, to set things right in a world where wealth and “stuff” are unbalanced? Charity is one thing, and a good thing, but that doesn’t change the system that supports inequality. What’s our responsibility as Christian voters when people or policies we vote for or against can affect the distribution of “stuff”, or people’s ability to acquire stuff, whether locally, nationally, or globally? What does the Spirit of Christ ask of us?
