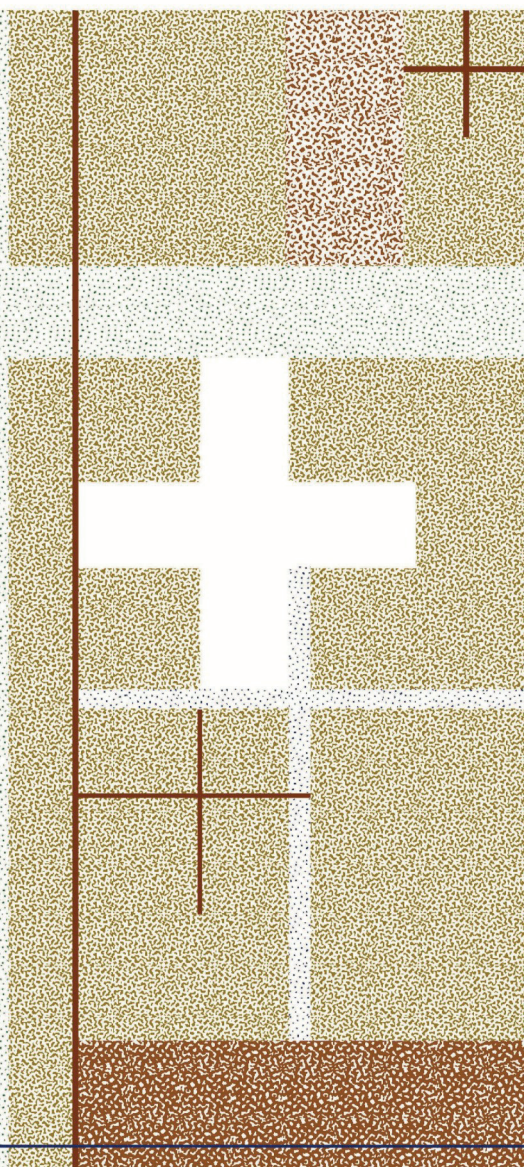

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Saint Bernard's Faith Family,

Greetings and Peace of the Lord be with you!

In today's Gospel message we hear how the Apostle Peter found it exceedingly difficult to accept that Jesus' mission would end with the cross and crucifixion. He did not see the value that pain and suffering were necessary for discipleship, and in turn became anxious that the Lord should avoid this course of action. Peter was outraged at the idea that such happenings should take place. Like most of us, he failed to fully grasp the role of suffering in God's plan of salvation. Peter thought that being part of the Kingdom was a matter of power and success. Therefore, these words were powerless to rid him of the idea of a Messiah of earthly splendor and glory. Peter had yet to learn that the standard of Christ was not those of prosperity and privilege. The outcome led to a strong reprimand from Jesus who cautioned Peter against adopting the standards of the world. The Gospel ends with a challenge to us to welcome hardship and to embrace pain and personal suffering, for to hold on to this life is to lose eternal life and everlasting peace.

In the grand scheme of things, we are set with a whole series of tests and challenges during our lifetime. The road is never a straight one, and suffering is a reality of human life. In the world we see greed, cruelty, hardships, and brokenness that seem to be the order of the day. Our earthly pilgrimage is so beset at times with trials and tribulations. I think it is safe to say, we have all experienced our share of hardships that come in the form of sickness, loss of a job or death in the family, just to name a few. It's a natural tendency to turn

our back on trouble, but running away from pain can never bring joy and strength, for to hide from it is to pretend that it does not exist in the first place. Being a Christian is a demanding honor because God's way of doing things is contrary to human expectations. Jesus tells us plainly in today's Gospel that discipleship involves denying ourselves, taking up our cross each day with faith, trust, and courage. We are called to follow Jesus' footsteps all the way to the end across the hill of Calvary. It's indeed a hard and demanding lesson for us to fully grasp, but the measure of greatness in the Kingdom of Heaven is the standard of the cross that leads to the glory of the Resurrection.

In light of today's Good News message, let us continue to help each other lift our crosses each day, whatever those crosses may be for us. Let us continue to pray, support, and encourage one another on our faith journey together. Jesus is urging us to never run from the cross but run to Him instead. We must never flee from a selfless and sacrificial embrace of hardships as God can and will transform our suffering into a means of His eternal glory and our sanctification. Let us especially ask our Good Lord to continually bless our parish family with an abundance of His gifts of grace, and may Our Blessed Mother Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, keep each one of us, and all those dear to us, always under the mantle of her love, care, and protection.

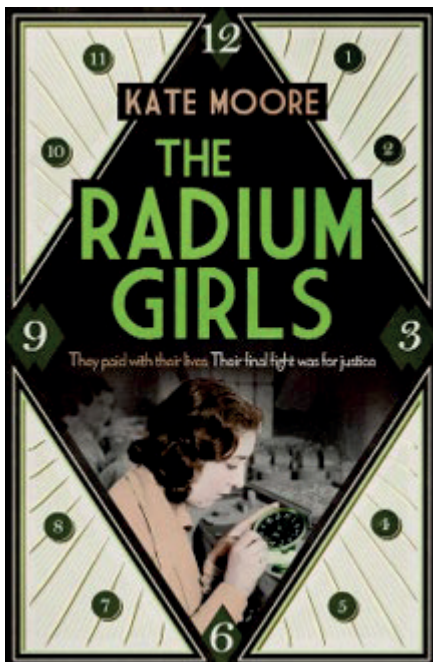

Wednesday Morning Book Discussion

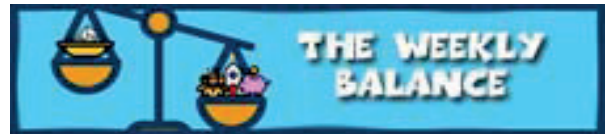
