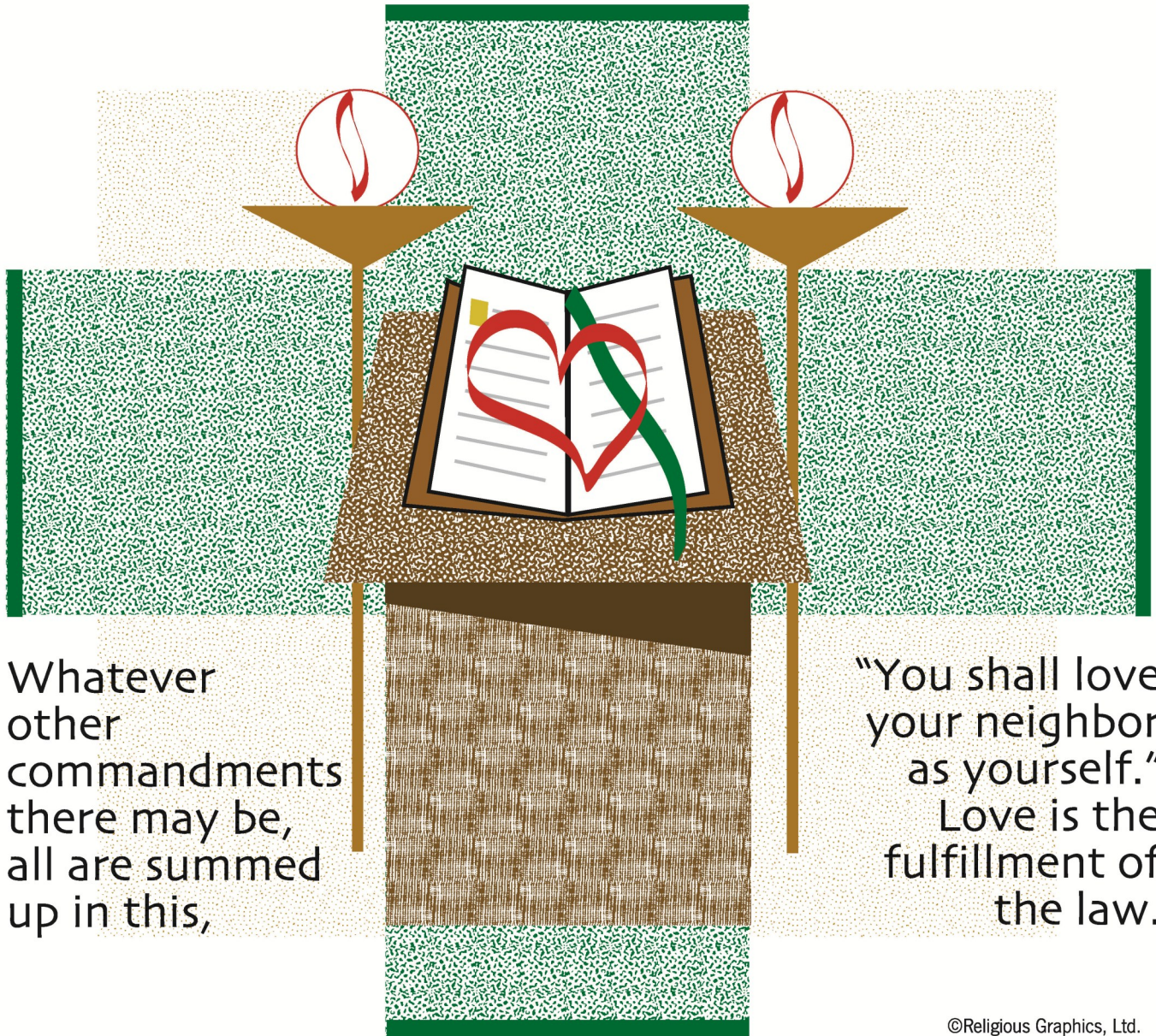

A September to Remember, Reflect, Pray and Act

As Catholic Christians and Americans, this month of September calls our attention to remembrance, reflection, prayer and action on several fronts. For many of us, our hearts and minds are heavy with the memory of the tragedy of **September 11, 2001**. Our hearts go out to the people who died that day or as a result of that day, as well as to all those whose lives were altered forever by injury, illness or loss. We remember with gratitude the bravery and dedication of the fire fighters, police officers, emergency and hospital personnel who assisted on that day and beyond, some of whom lost their lives in the aftermath. On this **25th anniversary** of the tragedy, there will be many solemn commemorations this year, including here at St. Bernard's, where our 8:00 am Mass and a special 7:00 pm Mass will remember, honor, and pray for all whose lives were affected by this tragedy, as well as pray for peace and reconciliation among all God's people.

The call to peace and reconciliation, a constant feature of the Gospel, is also the theme of the United States Catholic Bishops' annual **National Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities**, held each year on September 9, the Memorial of Saint Peter Claver, a 17th century Jesuit priest from Catalonia who served and ministered to enslaved Africans in Cartagena, Colombia for 38 years. This day of prayer was established in 2016 in response to increased racial tension in our country.

Since then, many of us have prayed, learned and taken action on behalf of racial equality and justice, but our bishops remind us that more needs to be done. They have provided parishes and individuals with prayers and other resources to guide us along this path. The link is too long to include here, but if you "google" "USCCB National Day of Prayer" you will be lead to links to prayers and suggestions as to how to get involved.

Our Church's call for justice extends also to the immigrant population among us. September 26 is the **World Day of Migrants and Refugees**. We are all sadly aware that immigration is a hotly-debated issue in our country, but as Catholics, our Church calls our attention to our Christian responsibility during **National Migration Week**, September 21-27. Again, we are called to learn, reflect, and pray as we form our attitudes and allow our speech and actions to reflect the values of Jesus and the teaching of our Church. 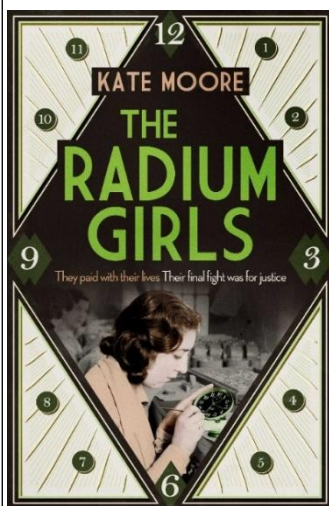

Wednesday Morning Book Discussion

1917. As a war raged across the world, young American women flocked to work, painting watches, clocks and military dials with a special luminous substance made from radium.
